Corynne Arnett is executive vice president and Chief Regulatory and Customer Officer.

She oversees regulatory affairs and strategy for Dominion Energy's operating companies, as well as regulatory compliance, electric market and FERC policy, and strategic risk. She also is responsible for customer experience strategy, customer service, and revenue management for Dominion Energy's more than 4 million electric and gas customers.



Arnett joined the company in 1997 as a tax professional. Since then, she has held numerous financial management and leadership positions in accounting, tax, and investor relations. She was named vice president–Financial Management in 2014 and vice president–Financial Management, Power Generation Group, in 2016, where she served as the business unit finance officer for Dominion Energy's portfolio of electric power generation facilities. In 2018, she became vice president– Customer Service for Dominion Energy Virginia. She was promoted to senior vice president– Regulatory Affairs and Customer Experience in December 2019, then was named executive vice president– Regulatory Affairs and Customer Experience in 2024. She assumed her current position in October 2025.

Prior to joining the company, she served for four years in tax practice in public accounting.

Arnett serves as a member of the board of directors of Energy Insurance Mutual Limited, a member of the board of directors of the Dominion Energy Foundation, and a member of the Advisory Committee for the Critical Consumer Issues Forum, a collaborative initiative between state regulators, consumer advocates, and the electric industry focused on addressing energy-related consumer issues.

She is a member of the Richmond Forum and the Library of Virginia Foundation, where she serves as Treasurer and Chair of the Finance Committee. She also is President of the board of trustees of The New Community School, a school in Richmond, Va., dedicated to empowering students with dyslexia and relation related learning differences. In addition, she previously served as Chair of the board of directors of the United Way of Greater Richmond & Petersburg, and served gubernatorial appointments to board of visitors of Norfolk State University and to the board of directors of the Virginia College Building Authority.

Arnett holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from Virginia Tech and a master's degree in taxation from Virginia Commonwealth University.
