David McFarland is senior vice president–Investor Relations and Treasurer.

He is responsible for developing and communicating the company’s investment narrative to members of the financial community, and for external outreach and engagement with investors on environmental, social, and governance issues, and oversight of corporate, commodity and credit risk management, corporate finance, cash management and corporate disbursements.



McFarland joined Dominion Energy in 2018 and led the company’s merger, acquisition and divestiture activity, which encompassed directing cross-disciplinary teams to perform financial modeling and analysis, conduct due diligence and deal structuring and negotiation. In 2020, he was named director–Investor Relations. In September 2022, he was promoted to vice president–Investor Relations. In 2024, he was named vice president–Investor Relations and Treasurer. He assumed his current role in March 2026.

Prior to joining Dominion Energy, McFarland was Director–Private Equity for First Reserve, a leading global private equity firm exclusively focused on energy, where he led investment origination and structuring, due diligence, execution and monitoring throughout the energy value chain for eight years. Prior to First Reserve, he was an Investment Banking Analyst for Barclays in the Global Natural Resources Group.

McFarland serves on the board of directors for Greater Richmond SCAN, a nonprofit organization that advocates for and protects children within the community by offering programs, training and workshops on positive parenting, and resources to strengthen families throughout the Greater Richmond area. He also serves on the board and is the Treasurer of Virginia Humanities, a nonprofit organization committed to sharing and increasing the knowledge of the Commonwealth’s history and culture by supporting educational and civic programs.

He received a B.S. in commerce with a concentration in finance from the McIntire School of Commerce at the University of Virginia in 2008.
