NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc.'s 2023 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP)

Why is this Notice Important?

- On January 30, 2023, Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. (the "Company") filed its 2023 Integrated Resource Plan with the Public Service Commission of South Carolina.
- This Notice is for customers of Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. and interested persons.
- The Public Service Commission (PSC) has scheduled a public hearing in this case.

What is an Integrated Resource Plan?

An Integrated Resource Plan is an electric utility's forecast or prediction of the electric utility's resources needed to provide you with safe, reliable electricity in the future. Essentially, it is a utility's strategic operational plan for the next 15 years that considers both customers' demand for electricity and the utility's ability to supply it.

The case was filed according to S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-37-40 and Commission Order No. 2022-840; and, this hearing has been scheduled according to Commission Order No. 2022-840 and S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 103-817.

Option B:

File a Petition to Intervene. An Intervenor becomes a party in the case. Intervenors have the right to testify, cross-examine witnesses, appeal the Commission's Final Decision, and must follow the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. To intervene, you must:

- Email a Petition to Intervene to contact@psc.sc.gov no later than **Monday, April 24, 2023**; or
- Mail a Petition to Intervene to 101 Executive Center Drive, Suite 100, Columbia, SC 29210 no later than **Monday, April 24, 2023**. Please include your email address.

******You must give a copy of your Petition to Intervene to all Parties in this case. Petitions to Intervene must meet the requirements of Commission Regulation 103-825 and must be approved by the Commission.

In the above referenced case, if the proposed tariffs contain any request for a change of rates, the proposed rates may be changed by the Commission.
