

# REVISED NOTICE OF FILING

**Docket No.: 2012-218-E - Application of South Carolina Electric & Gas Company for Increases and Adjustments in Electric Rate Schedules and Tariffs, and Request for Mid-Period Reduction in Base Rates for Fuel**

**AND**

**Docket No.: 2022-74-E - Request of Dominion Energy South Carolina, Incorporated to Decrease Its Rate Rider Related to Pension Costs from (\$0.00020) to (\$0.00073) Per Kilowatt-Hour (\*\*This Filing Includes a Request for a Decrease to the Pension Cost Component Rider to Retail Rates\*\*)**

## **Why is this Notice Important?**

- Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. (the "Company") filed a request with the Public Service Commission of South Carolina (the "Commission") for approval to increase the Company's Rider Related to Pension Costs (the "Pension Rider").

## **What is Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc.'s Pension Rider?**

- The Pension Rider is an annual true-up of Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc.'s pension (retirement) costs based on conditions in financial markets and other factors.

## **What does Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. want the Commission to approve in this case?**

- Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. requests the Commission approve an increase in the Company's Pension Rider from (\$0.00073) per kWh (decrement) to \$0.00037 per kWh (increment), resulting in an increase in the Pension Rider of \$0.00110 per kWh.
- The Pension Rider increase is for all the Company's retail electric rate schedules for bills rendered on and after the first billing cycle of May 2023.
- The projected balance of pension costs through April 2023 has increased by approximately \$4.7 million using the December 31, 2022, actual balance, currently approved Pension Rider, and current cost estimates.

## **How will the increase in the Pension Rider impact a residential customer's bill who uses an average of 1,000 kWh per month?**

- As a result of the pension rider, a customer using 1,000 kWh per month would see a bill increase of \$1.10 per month.
- This case was filed according to S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-140, 58-27-820, and 58-27-830 and Commission Order No. 2012-951.

**Option B:**

File a Petition to Intervene. An Intervenor becomes a party in the case. Intervenors have the right to testify, cross-examine witnesses, appeal the Commission's Final Decision, and must follow the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. To intervene, you must:

**\*\***You must give a copy of your Petition to Intervene to all Parties in this case. Petitions to Intervene must meet the requirements of Commission Regulation 103-825 and must be approved by the Commission.

**In the above referenced case, if the proposed tariffs contain any request for a change of rates, the proposed rates may be changed by the Commission.**
