Carter M. Reid is executive vice president, chief of staff and corporate secretary for Dominion Energy, and president-Dominion Energy Services.

In addition to serving as chief of staff to Dominion Energy's executive chairman, she oversees the corporate services provided to Dominion Energy's operating companies, including information technology, security and aviation, human resources, facilities and supply chain management. She also serves as the corporate secretary for Dominion Energy's Board of Directors.

Reid joined the company in 1996 as assistant general counsel. Since then, she has held numerous management positions in legal and services. While in the legal department, she focused on mergers and acquisitions, finance, securities law and general corporate law. She was promoted to vice president–Governance and corporate secretary in 2007 and was named vice president, general counsel, chief compliance officer and corporate secretary in 2011. Reid became senior vice president–Administrative Services, chief compliance officer and corporate secretary in 2013 and assumed the title of chief administrative officer in 2014. She was promoted to executive vice president in 2017 and to her current position in 2019.

Before joining Dominion Energy, Reid was an associate at McGuireWoods and Hunton & Williams.

She serves as chairman of the board of directors of Energy Insurance Mutual and serves on the boards of directors for Community Foundation for a greater Richmond, Richmond World Affairs Council, The B2B Project Foundation, and the advisory board of Virginia Repertory Theatre. She is also on the board of trustees of Collegiate School, a member of the Richmond Regional Council for GoVirginia, and serves on the University of Richmond's School of Law's Advisory Board.

A graduate of James Madison University, Reid received her law degree from the University of Richmond School of Law.
