Hi Jim,

I made a few, inconsequential suggestions. You did a good job.

For future conversation, the peaking variables I think matter the most to fish, erosion, and bank vegetation are the rate of ramp up (the angle of the ascending side), the duration of the peak (from toe to toe), and the amplitude of the peak. I arrived at this conclusion by reviewing the input from several folks, and then discounting input from Pete who identified all possible variables as critical. I think we could come up with an index of deviation from the unregulated river that would include all three variables so that DG could decide week by week or day by day how to work the index to reduce the deviation by the required amount. We've got 5 years to think about it.
