Sally Wetzler (standing outside): Dominion has done a lot of things with not just j-rock, but also the park system.

Sally Wetzler: It's kind of the the perfect partnership with Dominion because of the fact all the work that was done with Dominion on the Reedy Creek ramp. Then with this ramp they can put in on an accessible and then they can take out on an accessible ramp if they want.

Sally Wetzler: Being a totally different kind of ramp that needs to be constructed by a big construction company and needs all sorts of stuff you know for foundations and anchors and rocks and all sorts of things we can't do the way that we did Reedy Creek.

Sally Wetzler: We have been raising money on our own and doing pretty well, but this does make it just a lot easier. I ran into a woman who's got a child that's disabled, that lives in the neighborhood and they go walking through the park, and she said "I can't wait until I can take him down to the water", and he's only about four I guess, but it's like I can't wait until I can take them down to the water (sally nods her head excitedly with a smile).
