

Net Metering Billing- No Previous Year Carryover

To help understand your bill, let's look at a few months from your current Net Metering period with no carryover from the previous year.

Note that this customer's anniversary is in July. From July to September, this customer has built up a 'Current Year Carryover' of 750 kilo watt hours. Starting in October, the customer returned 200 kilo watts to the grid. This was then credited to their carryover bringing the total carryover to 950 kilo watt hours.

As we move into November, the customer used more than they generated, and 400 kilo watt hours were delivered from Dominion Energy to the customer. This 400 kilo watt hours was taken from the carryover leaving the customer with a 550- kilo watt hour carryover credit.

Moving into December, the customer again used more than they generated, and 150 kilo watt hours were delivered from Dominion Energy to the customer. The 150 kilo watt hours were taken from the customer's carryover. So that went from 550 kilo watt hours now to 400 kilo watt hours.

Now that you have an idea of how the Billing and Crediting works from month to month, let's look at the end of this customers' Net Metering period.

At year end, the customer accumulated 600 kilo watt hours in credit. Over the year, the customer was billed for 450 kilo watt hours. Moving into the next yearly cycle, the customer can only carryover 450 kilo watt hours of their 600 kilo watt hours. This is because the amount the customer was billed for throughout the year was less than the credit they accumulated.
