Dan: He did convoy duty in the North Atlantic, (holding up his father's naval uniform) then he transferred and piloted a landing craft for a period of time, including at Normandy.

Bonnie (a black and white photograph shows her father in uniform): Daddy was, was the pilot of B-17, their name was also the Hell's Angels.

Dan: Yeah, I'm very proud of my father's service in the war. And it was his service in the Navy that inspired me to serve in the Navy myself.

Bonnie: Always been so proud of my father and I, I don't even have words to tell you what I think of my dad.
