

Dominion Energy is committed to building, operating and maintaining Moriah Energy Center, a liquified natural gas (LNG) facility, in accordance with all applicable regulations. We're also committed to being a good neighbor in Person County by minimizing operational impacts in the community.



Emergency Management

Dominion Energy will have the necessary equipment onsite to manage a response in the unlikely event of an emergency without outside assistance, including automatic and remote shut-down capabilities. First responders will also be equipped and trained to assist.



End Users

Moriah Energy Center will support the natural gas needs of over 400,000 Dominion Energy customers who use natural gas for home heating, cooking and manufacturing across the region.



Light

A significant tree buffer will remain on the property, so lighting impacts are not anticipated.



Experience

Dominion Energy owns several LNG facilities across its footprint, including an LNG facility near downtown Cary that the company has operated safely and reliably for nearly 50 years in a residential and commercial area.



Water Usage

The vast majority of the well water that will be used once the facility is operational will be for employee facilities and not for plant processes or natural gas liquefaction.



Delivery

LNG will be converted back to a gas and dispatched through Dominion Energy's existing pipeline infrastructure. Trucking of LNG will not be a routine part of operations.



Noise

Noise will not exceed 85 decibels three feet from equipment. Considering Moriah Energy Center's operating footprint and the tree buffer, operating noise is not expected to impact surrounding property owners.



Compliance

Any new parent company will comply with all local, state and federal regulations to operate Moriah Energy Center.
