T15 **Reliability Project**



PROJECT SUMMARY

Dominion Energy North Carolina (DENC) will build a new, state-of-the-art compressor station in Ruffin and a new 45-mile pipeline along primarily existing rights-of-way from Eden to Roxboro to continue complying with regulations and meet demand for natural gas. Construction will begin as early as the third quarter of 2025.

From construction through operations, safety is the top priority. DENC maintains construction and operating policies and procedures that adhere to state and federal safety requirements that provide specific directions in inspection, testing, operation, preventive maintenance, repair and vigilant patrols of facilities. Local DENC employees will operate and maintain the pipeline once it is in service.

What about the environmental impacts?


DENC is committed to being a good steward of the environment and following all permit specifications. Because DENC is paralleling the new pipeline on existing pipeline right-of-way, this helps reduce environmental impacts.

Why are you building this pipeline?

The T15 project will ensure continued compliance with safety regulations and reliably meet demand for natural gas. The project was planned before generation needs were proposed, but the diameter size of the pipeline has increased to accommodate the demand for natural gas in the region.

Where would the compression station be located?

DENC owns and operates a compressor station in Ruffin and plans to build a new one close by.
