Why is this Notice Important?

 Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. (the "Company") filed a request with the Public Service Commission of South Carolina (the "Commission") for approval to increase the Company's Rider Related to Pension Costs (the "Pension Rider").

What is Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc.'s Pension Rider?

 The Pension Rider is an annual true-up of Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc.'s pension (retirement) costs based on conditions in financial markets and other factors.

What does Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. want the Commission to approve in this case?

- Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. requests the Commission approve an increase in the Company's Pension Rider from (\$0.00073) per kWh (decrement) to \$0.00037 per kWh (increment), resulting in an increase in the Pension Rider of \$0.00110 per kWh.
- The Pension Rider increase is for all the Company's retail electric rate schedules for bills rendered on and after the first billing cycle of May 2023.
- The projected balance of pension costs through April 2023 has increased by approximately \$4.7 million using the December 31, 2022, actual balance, currently approved Pension Rider, and current cost estimates.

How will the increase in the Pension Rider impact a residential customer's bill who uses an average of 1,000 kWh per month?

- As a result of the pension rider, a customer using 1,000 kWh per month would see a bill increase of \$1.10 per month.
- This case was filed according to S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-140, 58-27-820, and 58-27-830 and Commission Order No. 2012-951.
