In 2014, Dominion Energy Green Power will purchase RECs from renewable energy facilities in Virginia and across the mid-Atlantic and Southeastern regions.



The Dominion Energy Green Power program is certified by Green-e® Energy; a non-profit, third-party organization which ensures product quality and customer protection. Green-e standards require that the RECs purchased through Dominion Energy Green Power are from new renewable facilities and that they are only used once, then retired. In 2013, Dominion Energy Green Power purchased 77.2% wind, 22.5% biomass, and 0.3% solar from Virginia, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Missouri.
